Monday, October 12, 2026

Here is our exciting itinerary:

Departure from JFK airport on October 12th 2026 for your flight to Cairo.

<u>Day 1</u>

Tuesday, October 13, 2026

Arrival at Cairo International airport, and upon arrival we will be met by our quides and transferred by coach to our hotel.

We will have the chance to book a facultative lunch at local Egyptian restaurant (with extra cost) before the check in at the hotel.

Rest of the day is free at leisure with the swimming pool at our hotel & overnight in Cairo.

Evening: Optional visit to the Sound & Light Show at Pyramids with extra cost.

Breakfast at the hotel, at 08:00 am. We will be met by our private Egyptologist in the hotel's lobby and picked to start our first visit by the Great pyramids - Cheops, Chephren & Mykerions; Cheops is the most colossal ever built. Next is a close-up look at Sphinx- a huge funeral complex guarded by the legendary lion body with the face of King Chephren.

The Great Pyramids of Giza built for the Pharaohs Cheops, Chephren and Mycerinus. They were constructed about 2500 BC with blocks of limestone from the plateau and from the Turah hills on the outskirts of Cairo.

The Great Pyramid of Cheops alone, the only present-day survivor of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, required over 2,300,000 blocks of stone, each weighing about 2.5 tons. At its base, it covers 13 acres of land. Millions of visitors come each year to ponder the fascinating mystery of their existence and explore the ancient burial chambers within.

Big news: The Great Pyramid became unlimited number of tickets available per day for entrance INSIDE through the staff. But this will be with extra cost for the ticket.

An optional Camel Ride for 10-15 minutes at Pyramids area could be arranged with your guide with extra cost.





When we're at the Pyramids area, we'll have a chance to make a stop to visit one of the trustable jewelry shops to buy your personal gifts. Facultative lunch at local restaurant with extra cost.

Then we drive to downtown (TAHRIR SQURE) to visit "the Egyptian Museum" of antiquities, sitting in the shadows of Cairo's modern town hall, the elegant coral-pink and copper-domed Egyptian Museum strikes a gentle pose. The restrained neo-classical French exterior is little preparation for the awesome array of treasures and ancient wonders that wait silently behind its arched windows.

Stepping through the entrance into the grand central atrium, monumental statues tower overhead from the imposing Colossus of Amenhotep III to King Djoser's life-size sculpture.

The ground floor galleries take you on a trip through time, each room filled with the splendors of a great kingdom. King Narmer's 5,000 year old palette is an item of major artistic and historical importance.

Galleries house over 1,700 items including

Ancient Egypt's cultural wealth is also shown in many other artefacts that reveal the skill of ancient artisans. But it's the upper floor that holds the greatest allure. The Tutankhamun Galleries house over 1,700 items including Tutankhamun's famous tomb, discovered in the Valley of the Kings in West-Thebes, opposite modern Luxor.

The Egyptian Museum is just simply unrivalled with over 136,000 items on display, not mentioning the hundreds of thousands in the basement. These items date back to the very origins of a united Egypt in 3,100 BC. The museum is renowned for holding the finest collection of Egyptian antiquities in the world.

At the end of the day you will be transferred to the hotel and overnight in Cairo.





After breakfast in your hotel, meet the guide at 08:00 am and we'll take you to visit **Memphis**, the capital of the Old Egyptian Kingdom and one of the most important cities throughout the history of ancient Egypt. From here we drive to **Sakkara**, see the earliest monumental stone tractor in Egypt, a stepped pyramid built for King Zoser (c. 2650 BC).

Facultative lunch at local restaurant with extra cost.

When we are in the area your guide will take you for a short stop to visit a nice handmade traditional carpet shop.

After a historical visit to the capital of the old Egyptian Kingdom we will continue our tour to show you another face of the Egyptian history, you will visit the renowned **Saladin Citadel** that was built by Saladin in the 12th Century and was the seat of power for the following 700 years. On the premises is the **Alabaster Mosque of Mohammed Ali**, one of the landmarks in Cairo whose minaret can be seen from any part of the city. The Mohammed Ali mosque was built in Turkish style.



Also you will visit **Khan El Khalili Bazaars** Shops in this district are legendary for fine brassware, copper, perfumes, leather, silver, gold, antiques and more!

At the end of the day we will transfer you to take the night sleeper train to travel to Aswan, dinner and overnight on board of the train.





After early breakfast on board of the train, arrival Aswan, upon arrival you will be met and transferred direct to your visit to the **Temple of Isis** by Lake Nasser on the Island of Philae.

We next transfer you to the **Nile Cruise** for check in and lunch on board.

You have the chance to relax on the swimming pool OR go with us to the Nubian Village. We do our DDT Charity event there.

At the end of the day we will transfer you back to your Nile cruise for dinner and overnight on board in Aswan.



After early breakfast on board of the Nile cruise you can have free time in the swimming pool **OR** have the possibility to book a unique and very special visit to **Abu Simbel Temples by bus or by flight with extra cost**.

Lunch and dinner will be served on board the cruise ship.

Sail from Aswan to Kom Ombo, visit **Kom Ombu temple**, the temple shared by the two Pharaohs gods Sobek and Haroeris.

Continue sailing to Edfu & overnight in Edfu.





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Day 6 Sunday, October 18, 2026

After breakfast, you will visit the **temple of Horus at Edfu**, continue sailing to cross Esna lock and continue sailing to Luxor. Arrival in Luxor and start your first visits to **Luxor Temple**.

Lunch and dinner will be served on board. Overnight on board.

Day 7 Monday, October 19, 2026

After breakfast, disembarkation from the Nile cruise, we will cross the Nile to the West Bank to visit the **Valley of the Kings** (3 tombs-Ramses first, Ramses The Third and Ramses the Ninth), where the pharaohs were buried in their grand tombs. Visit the huge Temple of Queen Hatshepsut at El Deir-El Bahari and the twin Colossi of Memnon.

When we're at the Valley of the Kings: You'll have the chance to **book** a facultative visit to the famous Tomb of Tut Ankh Amoun and also the Tomb of Seti the First (with extra cost). Cross the Nile back to the East Bank to visit "Karnak Temple".

(Facultative lunch in a Nile restaurant at Luxor with extra cost).
You will have a free time at Luxor till the train departure to Cairo.
At the end of the day (about 20:00 evening) we will transfer you to Luxor train station to take the night sleeper train to Cairo (departure at 21:00 evening).

Dinner and overnight on board of the train.







Day 8 Tuesday, October 20, 2026

After early breakfast on board of the train, arrival Giza train station and direct from there you will be transferred to **Alexandria** on the Mediterranean Sea (about 220 km from Cairo).

We will have the chance to see another face from the Egyptian history (Greek –Roman and modern), upon arrival we will a short visit to **EL**Morsi Abu EL Abbas Mosque and view Qaiet Bay Citadel from outside.

Facultative lunch in a good fish restaurant at Alexandria with extra cost.

Drive to the hotel for check-In and overnight in Alexandria.



Wednesday, October 21, 2026

After breakfast at the hotel, we will take you to visit the Catacombs and the Alexandria Library, have the rest of the day free on the swimming pool or on the beach at Alexandria.

Overnight at the hotel in Alexandria.











After early breakfast you will be transferred back to Cairo upon arrival will be checked-In the hotel and the rest of the day will be free time on the swimming pool at your hotel OR optional tour to visit the Old Cairo.

The optional visit of OLD CAIRO (Jewish, Christian and Islamic sights).

The visit of old Cairo including Ibn Tuloon Mosque, Amru bin Aas Mosque (The first mosque built in Egypt), Babylon fort, Ben Ezra Synagogue (the well where Prophet Moosa's mother hide him), Virgin Mary Abu Serga Church where Prophet Isa (Jesus Christ) and Mother Virgin Maryam stayed, lunch during the tour and continue our tour to visit Al Azhar mosque (with extra cost).

After visit we will transfer you back to the hotel and Overnight stay in Cairo.



Travel Back Home

After breakfast, transfer to Cairo Airport for your flight back home.

The above itinerary is flexible and may be changed in sequence according to the operating ship but not on visits.

It's been a wonderful 10 days in the beautiful country of Egypt!

CANCELLATION POLICY:

- 300 days or more, prior to scheduled group arrival date, no PENALTY will be assessed.
- 300-240 days prior to/up to group arrival date of trip: There will be a 25% Penalty of Total cost of room.
